## General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Starts on Friday 25 May

### IMPORTANT INFORMATION ENCLOSED!

With effect from Friday 25 May 2018, the Data Protection Directive (DPD) will be replaced by the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR). This is the new European legal framework for the protection of personal data. All carers registered with us need to complete and return the Consent Form enclosed in this newsletter.

The change is expected to have a far-reaching impact on the way that all organisations manage any personal data they hold.



### What does this mean for the Carers Centre?

We are now legally required to ask all carers registered with us to give formal permission to hold data on them. This applies to both written and electronically stored information.

### What do you have to do now?

We are now asking all carers who are registered with us to return the enclosed Consent Form to the Centre as soon as possible but by **Wednesday 16 May 2018** at the latest.

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## SDS Workshops

We will be running Self-Directed Support (SDS) Workshops in late June and early to mid-August. The venues are still to be confirmed, but the dates, times and locations are on the back page. The aims of the workshops are to explain to carers what SDS is all about, how it works, what eligibility means and what the four options of SDS are. The workshops will help give you confidence when completing your Adult Carer Support Plan and making your own decisions about the support that's right for you and the person you care for. ## Accessible holiday accommodation in Cupar, Fife

Moira Henderson, the owner, has been very supportive of Angus Carers Centre and has kindly offered to show us round. We're planning a trip on **Monday 11 June 2018**, hopefully by minibus and perhaps we will manage to organise lunch during the trip too!

- Saturday 4 August: 'Story of the Beach Boys - a Tribute', Webster Theatre, Arbroath.



## The Carers Act - a Brief Summary and List of the Main Points

The Carers (Scotland) Act 2016 came into existence on 1 April 2018. In short, the purpose of the Carers Act is to ensure better and more consistent support for unpaid carers across Scotland.

Shared Care Scotland has put together a tool-kit document to help people understand what the Act entails, and we've included below an introduction to the Act and also a list of the key facts. 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### Introduction to the Carers Act

On 1 April this year, Scotland took a major step towards extending and enhancing the rights of unpaid carers with the introduction of the Carers (Scotland) Act 2016. This comes at a time when there is increasing pressure on health and social care services and greater reliance on those who take on caring responsibilities. The Act aims to ensure that carers are supported more consistently, so they can continue to care if they wish, and are able to do so in good health and with a life alongside their caring responsibilities.

The Act gives carers new rights including the right to have or request an Adult Carer Support Plan or Young Carer Statement, and also sets out duties relating to support, breaks from caring, hospital discharge, and information and advice.

### Key facts

From 1 April 2018, the following will apply as a result of the Carers Act taking effect:

- **Adult Carer Support Plans/Young Carer Statements:** Carers have the right to be offered or request an Adult Carer Support Plan (ACSP) or Young Carer Statement (YCS), setting out their personal outcomes and identified needs.
- **Information and advice:** Local authorities are required to establish and maintain an information and advice service for carers. They must also publish and keep under review a Short Breaks Services Statement. This statement must be published by 31st December 2018.
- **Support to carers:** Local authorities have a duty to provide support to carers, based on the carer's needs which meet local eligibility criteria. Local authorities also have powers to enable them to provide support to carers who do not meet local eligibility criteria.
- **Breaks from caring:** Local authorities are required to consider whether any support provided should include, or take the form of, a break from caring. They must also have regard to the desirability of breaks being provided on a planned basis.
- **Hospital discharge:** Health boards have a duty to inform the carer and to invite their views before a cared-for person is discharged from hospital. These must be taken into account before the discharge of the cared-for person.
- **Carers' charter:** Scottish Government have published a Carers' charter which sets out the rights of carers in or under the Act.

### WRAP Training for Carers

Wellness Recovery Action Planning (WRAP) is a self-management tool used to help individuals take more control over their own mental health and wellbeing. WRAP can help people in moving beyond personal distress and learning more about themselves.

WRAP recognises that you are the expert in your own experience and it can also help you to cope better within your caring role. A total of 25 carers have now completed the WRAP workshops and given us the following feedback:

- “I learned to be more myself, and not always the carer.”
- “Am more aware of coping skills and how beneficial these plans are to my wellness.”
- “I’m more in control than I realised.”
- “It’s been a useful experience and one I can refer to if I am feeling low and vulnerable.”



Many thanks to everyone who responded to our website consultation. We had 25 responses. The feedback on this was very encouraging. You told us we had the right balance of information, with one respondent saying that “Whoever is responsible for the website is doing a great job!” Some of you told us that you used the website to check out the dates of events and groups, whilst others suggested that making this information easier to find by providing an events calendar would be useful.

We need to refresh our website for lots of technical reasons and to ensure that it is as secure as possible to meet with the new General Data Protection Reform (GDPR) compliance standards, which are enforceable from 25 May 2018 onwards.

Building on the success of our Crowdfunder campaign, we also wish to be able to embed ‘on line’ giving into our main website rather than potential donors having to click lots of times to get to the right section of the site, which we know puts people off.



The most important improvement that carers will notice is that we will be able to put all of our carer news into one place. You may know that, at the moment, we have two websites, one for adult carers and one for young carers. Our work with young carers is now a much more integral element of our service, particularly as we work with families through our Families Programme. Whilst we will create a dedicated space in our website especially for young carers, we also want to strengthen the links between the Young Carers' Service and our other work, since many aspects are relevant to all carers - e.g. short breaks, volunteering, carers' rights, the new Carers charter, etc. In summary, you have told us that our website is working well, so we will make sure that any changes build on this success.

We hope to have the updated website ready by July 2018. We would like to hear from you during the development of our demonstration website, to give us feedback before it goes live. ### **Tesco Bags of Help Scheme - Help Angus Young Carers to Win £4,000!**

From 1 May to 30 June 2018 at the Tesco store in Arbroath, the Angus Young Carers (AYC) will be taking part in the Bags of Help Scheme. If the young carers win this vote, then the AYC service will be awarded £4,000 from Tesco.

If you sometimes shop at this store, then you could help us to win this money. All you have to do is put one of the blue, plastic tokens in the glass container with the 'Angus Young Carers' label on it. The blue, plastic tokens are given to you at the till by the check-out operator (if you use the self-service checkouts, then the person who looks after these check-outs can give you the voting token) when you make a purchase. The glass voting booth is located near the store's entrance door, close to the self-service check-outs. And that's all there is to it!
